The Brittany's Hope Sunflower Project was born from a dream of providing essential items and a small measure of comfort to those children aging out of over crowded orphanages. These children often leave with nothing but the clothes they are wearing.

One can only imagine the fear and trepidation confronting these precious children as they are forced to strike out on their own at such a tender age to make room for the incoming younger orphans. The Sunflower Project's goal was to provide a duffel bag with a set of clothes, undergarments, toiletries, blankets, towels, shoes, rain gear, first aid kits and other necessary items, to children facing this new chapter in their lives, alone.

This ambitious project was met with delays in gathering and storing enough items to fill 404 bags and arranging their shipment to Vietnam. With the help of Elizabethtown College students and a generous donation from Binex Line shipping company the bags were packed and shipped to Vietnam in March. In late May, Brittany's Hope, in a joint venture with Elizabethtown College, traveled to Vietnam to complete a number of service projects for orphanages in need. We partnered with the Da Nang Red Cross Association to distribute the bags to older children aging out of five orphan centers in the region. On *International Children's Day*, we were honored to have several government officials and local news crews attend the Sunflower Distribution Ceremony.
