




Imagine having your family separated due to post-election violence, and ending up on the street, far from your village in the city of Nairobi. This was a reality for Martin, and many other children.

The Kibera slum is a harsh reality, even for the most streetwise adults. Growing up in Kibera, children like Joseph lived among discarded trash, violence

and illegal activity. They were often subject to police brutality, simply because they were street children. Taking turns sleeping, with one standing guard, these children faced insurmountable obstacles.

Enter the Home of Hope, run by loving Catholic Sisters. By working with the boys within Kibera, and eventually resettling outside of the city center, they have truly offered them something many never had: a home.

In 2005, temporary structures were built out of corrugated iron sheets to make a place to feed, shelter, educate, and rehabilitate these hurting children. The boys see education as a chance to escape this life, so they work hard to do well. Despite the negative attitude toward their pasts, these boys often outperform and

outshine classmates in both good character and education.

What was meant to be temporary has long withstood expectations, and 10 years later, still stands as the housing for these children. Although additions and improvements have been made, the drafty walls, metal beds, and dim lighting doesn't foster a cozy environment. While Joseph and the other boys are happy, they dream of warm beds, sun gleaming through the windows, and a proper kitchen where they can enjoy meals together.

With the purchase of land already secured, we hope to provide these boys who have suffered through unimaginable challenges, with all of the comforts of home that they deserve.

This Summer, we will build a new 14,833 sq ft facility complete with living quarters, classrooms and everything else the boys will need in order to grow and feel the safety and comfort of a true home.



## **Freedom for Anh**

Picture that you are an eight-year-old boy living in an orphanage in Viet Nam. You cannot speak and your movements are constrained by muscles that are weak and tight. You are loved and cared for, but because of your disabilities you spend most of the time lying in a bed, waiting for your friends to come and visit. This is the life of Anh.

I met Anh at the House of Love last May while traveling in Viet Nam with a group of Elizabethtown College students and Brittany's Hope supporters. As I sat by his bedside, children regularly ran into his room. Every time the door opened, he brightened and smiled. When there was a noise outside his door, he strained to turn and look.

Knowing some of the limitations of rehabilitative healthcare in Viet Nam, the Elizabethtown College students were determined to do something to help Anh. It seemed as though a wheelchair might have a positive impact on Anh's quality of life and the well-being of his caregivers.

This spring, through the advocacy of Brittany's Hope, the orphanage was able to obtain a new wheelchair for Anh! Now, he is able to sit upright and leave his room, where he can finally be with his friends.

Nine years ago this May, my mother, a few college students, and I embarked on a service trip with Brittany's Hope. As the resident Occupational Therapist on the trip, I worked alongside my students to deliver care to children who faced significant challenges. We tended to the children and introduced techniques to better equip the caretakers. In the meantime, my mother devoted her time to holding and loving a baby girl who had recently been abandoned at the gate of the House of Love Orphanage, a home fully supported by Brittany's Hope.

I was deeply moved by the stories my mother shared of the baby girl, and I felt called to play a larger role in her precious life. It was then that I decided to become Thien Thanh's sponsor mother.
