Their dedication funded 2 special needs adoption grants, uniting 2 children with loving families.

Meanwhile, 600 miles away in Michigan, one woman has shown us that volunteers can make a vast transformation — all one needs is passion. Rebecca Cruttenden, a Brittany's Hope grant recipient, has been paying it forward by raising funds and assisting other families in bringing their children home.

On one of her morning runs, she thought,

"How can I make my recreation co-exist with my passion?"

The idea came to her rather quickly, and it was simple. Include others by way of a virtual Ironman! As she trains for her Ironman, others across the US are invited to exercise with her – motivating each other to raise funds for abandoned and at-risk children.

Her aspiration didn't stop at competing either, as she started a cookie business, Clara Cookies, where all the proceeds benefit children with special needs. To date, Rebecca and her family of volunteers, have raised over \$200,000 for Brittany's Hope Adoption Grants.

A team of 11 college students and two professors from Delaware Technical Community College have committed to partnering with Brittany's Hope through service in Viet Nam.

The team members will be covering their own travel costs and accommodations, and are diligently working to raise funds toward a pledged goal of \$12,000, for project. They will

Bringing Sweet Thea Home

Adoption is a loving and personal choice; one that is not short of challenges, personal sacrifices, and loss. Each and every adoption journey has its own unique twists and turns — like a roller coaster; with one never really knowing if the ride will be fast or slow, smooth or bumpy, but hoping it will come to jubilation.

For Caroline, it was a rewarding voyage, but not without personal sacrifices. Her two week in-country trip in India morphed into an eleven-week stay. As a single, working woman, she endured navigating India's bureaucratic policies, but continued to move mountains. Despite the challenges, she recounted the joy of bringing sweet Thea home.

"The memories of the time are still fresh in my mind. I remember fighting for the court documents to be issued so we could go home. Thea was listed as HIV+, a medical diagnosis I was prepared for. Upon arriving home, I intended to have her blood drawn to confirm her HIV status, but that didn't go as planned. Due to Thea's tiny veins, our nurses were unable to draw her blood. At this point, and not wanting to force any additional trauma upon her, I discontinued the blood draw attempts.

It took me 8 weeks until I felt

comfortable to take Thea back to the Children's Hospital. With the help of a specialist, lots of Band-Aids, stickers, and a large stuffed owl, Thea's blood was finally drawn into 8 vials. A few days later, the nurse called with incredible news: Thea was not HIV+.

We were blessed, but a part of me was confused. The life I had planned for was suddenly different. I stillread Thea books about HIV and her favorite one is A Positive Superhero: Growing Up with HIV.

Two years ago, I never thought this adoption would come to fruition; a year ago I never thought I would ever be able to leave India...

and today, I am a proud momma wanting to slow down time just so I can relish the charms of the present moment."

It has been a privilege to have traveled alongside Caroline, and all of our grant recipient families in their adoption journeys. Hearing of the personal sacrifices the families make is both inspiring and humbling. We are grateful to our families for their "yes" to adoption and are committed to standing by their side with encouragement and support.

Against All Odds An Older Child Searches for His Family

Last spring, at this time, much of our attention was focused on a handwritten letter and a picture of a 15-year-old boy, Dai, from our sponsorship program in Viet Nam. Dai had bravely written to express his deep yearning to find his forever family.

We were all committed to advocating for Dai, so all options were explored. We sprang into action raising funds toward a \$10K adoption grant, making phone calls to families, and even publishing his letter. As a teenage boy, time was running out for Dai; he had less than 6 months before becoming ineligible for adoption. Despite our efforts, we knew that failure was a distinct possibility.

Against all odds, you made it possible for Dai's dream become a reality. On January 6th, his family made the long journey to Viet Nam and brought Dai home. He now has the support of a father, the comraderie of a sister, and the love of a mother.

Dai's mother recently shared with us, "In the Brittany's Hope Spring 2017 newsletter, Dai wrote a letter to his future forever family — and we are now that family!

While Dai was praying for a forever family, we were praying for a son.

Dai has been home for a little over 5 weeks, is adapting well, and making friends. It has been wonderful to see the close bond between Dai and his younger sister, Siobhan.

We immensely enjoy sharing Dai's new firsts, like experiencing snow for the first time! Although he doesn't enjoy the cold weather, he is fascinated by snow and built his very first snowman. Dai recently told us that his greatest desire is to attend a college or university to further his education. He thinks this is a tremendous opportunity American children have that most children in Viet Nam will never experience."

Dai's family is grateful and blessed to become this family of four. Without the support of Brittany's Hope donors, sponsors, and advocates, Dai would not have been able to have the wonderful opportunities in life that now await him. Now, his family can experience the joy of helping him become the best he can possibly be."

Creating an Oasis

It's easy to find Sister Maurice - just follow the giggles of the children at the Oasis of Peace home in a rural village of Kisumu, Kenya. With an enchanting smile, Sister Maurice has a gift for listening intently to each child, sharing in the both their joys and their heartbreak.

It's difficult to find a family not affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Kisumu County. The disease prevalence there is almost 4 times higher than in other areas of Kenya. It's as if an entire generation of adults is missing, leaving the children behind to be cared for by elders.

With Sister Maurice's own personal loss of her parents and two siblings, she knows firsthand the emotional turmoil of orphans and struggles within the community. She established a home to care for these children — yet, within the first 2 weeks, the home was flooded with frighten and malnourished children.

"Those first few years were very difficult and frightening. I spent many sleepless nights questioning God and wondering where I would find the resources needed to feed and care for these children. Without a choice, I had to turn to the very people who knocked at my door for help."

She managed to keep over 60 scared kids safe, making it clear that she was born to take on this joyful burden.

With her calm assertiveness and natural love, she empowered those around her to assist in any way they could: some donated corn or bananas, others carried drinking water. Yet though the surrounding community gave what they could, the resources weren't enough to sustain the home.

Moved by Sister Maurice's resilience and fight to care for these precious children, Brittany's Hope joined in her efforts. In 2 short years, with your guidance, she has equipped the home with proper furnishings, established a school, drilled a well, developed a large garden, and raised livestock. With each challenge, Sister Maurice rises to the task and enables others to find strength, take ownership, and create lasting change to guide future generations.

Sister Maurice has created an oasis, a home filled with beautiful music of kids' laughter. She recently shared with us, "I sincerely feel happy and fulfilled when the lives of orphans and the vulnerable are changed."

Please help our partners continue to be a guide for those less fortunate.




