A Daughter Inspires a Mission

On April 23, 2007, we learned that we would once again be parents to another beautiful child, our daughter Julia. Unlike our first two, the news didn't come from our doctor, but instead our caseworker. When they unveiled her picture, we instantly fell in love and knew she was meant to be ours.

After months of filing paperwork and waiting, we were united with our beautiful

daughter on Thanksgiving Day. She was only 15 months old at the time, but she joined her older brother and sister to make our family complete.

Julia's life began in the Ben Tre Child Protection Center, a government run orphanage for abandoned, street and abused children. The center was small, utilitarian and clean, but it was evident, even during our first visit, there were a lot of needs not being met.

At our Giving and Receiving Ceremony, when we signed paperwork to complete our adoption, we also committed to adopting the culture and customs of Viet Nam. We knew that one day we would be back to visit Julia's birth country. Five years later, when the opportunity to tour the whole country came about, we made the voyage back to Viet Nam.

While visiting Ben Tre, we became aware that life at the center had become even more challenging. Since inter-country adoptions between the U.S. and Viet Nam had ceased, most of the adoption agencies were no longer providing aid to the orphanages. It was evident they were understaffed despite having even more children with severe special needs.

One child in particular pierced our hearts and has never left our minds. She was about 4 years old with Cerebral Palsy and could barely stand on her own. When you picked her up, she hugged you as tight as she could and wouldn't let go. If this beautiful little girl had access to therapy, care and treatment, she might have been able to develop and blossom physically.

This time, we left Viet Nam determined to find help for all of the kids at Ben Tre. We realized sending aid directly to a foreign country could be difficult, and potentially unlawful, so we starting searching the

internet for resources. We were thrilled to find Brittany's Hope, who had a connection to the Ben Tre orphanage! The next morning, I was on the phone with their Executive Director, Mai-Lynn Abel Sahd, learning about their strong foundation in Viet Nam. Together, we implemented the Ben Tre Milk Program to provide nutritional support to all the children at the center.

Our family has been working very hard to spread awareness to support this very worthy cause. We just recently learned that Brittany's Hope is committed to taking on the Ben Tre Protection Center as a full partner, to be a steady source of support and launch a Child Sponsorship program!

The 70 children currently in care at the Ben Tre Protection Center deserve compassion, love, and protection every bit as much as our daughter, Julia. As a father and friend of the Ben Tre Protection center, I am asking you to consider sponsoring a child today to help change a life forever.

Hope Preserves a Tribe

On a recent trip to Ethiopia, Brittany's Hope distributed new uniforms to 150 kids at the Dawn of Hope center. As the children jumped and shouted with joy, it became clear just how impactful this program has been on the Negede-Woyto tribe. Just 5 years before, visitors weren't welcome and the village was full of garbage and human waste.

After decades of living as social outcasts without rights, the Negede-Woyto tribe struggled to grow with their country. Ethiopian people, including government officials, scoffed at the thought of helping or even interacting with them. Despite such negativity, Brittany's Hope and our trusted partners saw ambition and promise in the tribe's children and knew education would be a catalyst to their success.

It began with a small group of bright children from Negede-Woyto families and 14 from the social majority attending classes in a small, rented building nearby. Family members that were comfortable with our partners were trained and given jobs teaching, cleaning and cooking. Most of them ended up bringing

Today, over 40 children from the Dawn of Hope have graduated and successfully enrolled in the public school system. Symbols of cultural acceptance like these have led the government to change their way of thinking and donate land for the construction of a new school, completed in 2014.




